

COVID-19: YOUR PARTNER DURING TIMES OF CRISIS

Tulsa Area United Way took immediate action to meet the needs of our community as schools and businesses closed to stop the spread of COVID-19.

- Partnered with Tulsa Community Foundation to raise more than \$3 million for COVID-19 related hardships, getting some of the first relief dollars out to those in need.
- Established a direct-service hub with 211 Eastern Oklahoma and the "Unite Us!" technology platform to assist with rent, utilities, and pharmacy prescriptions.
- Provided one-on-one consultation and ongoing communications regarding the impact of the CARES act and the PPP/EIDL loan process so partner agencies could apply and support their employees.

OTHER MAJOR EMERGENCIES IN WHICH TULSA AREA UNITED WAY RESPONDED:

2018 Teacher Walkout

TAUW orchestrated the communication and coordination between 93 organizations, including Hunger Free Oklahoma and Community Food Bank of Eastern Oklahoma, to provide meals, activities and transportation for families during the 11-day walkout.
