Tulsa Area United Way Announces New Class for neXtula

The Nonprofit Executive Leadership Training (neXtula) program, led by the Tulsa Area United Way, has announced its new class for 2018.

The mission of neXtula is to prepare the next generation of non-profit leaders for the Tulsa community. NeXtula is a 10-month commitment that holds monthly sessions on diversity and inclusion, non-profit leadership, innovation and more.

“With this program, non-profit leaders will be equipped with valuable skills to lead our non-profit sector for the coming years,” said Cindy Longacre, director of community initiatives.

This is the only United Way program of its kind in the U.S., and while the course is free to participants, it is limited to 15.
